- AAESQ Responds to Petition in the National Assembly

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Recently, AAESQ became aware of a petition sponsored in the National Assembly that misrepresents the role of school administrators in supporting students with special needs.

In a letter dated January 13, AAESQ formally raised serious concerns about the petition, highlighting several inaccuracies, including unsubstantiated claims that school administrators ignore professional evaluations or delay the implementation of accommodations. The Association emphasized that decisions regarding student services are made collaboratively under Article 96.14 of the Education Act, not unilaterally by principals. The letter also noted that the petition misrepresents administrators as obstacles to supporting students with special needs and unfairly questions their professional judgment and integrity. AAESQ has formally requested that the petition be withdrawn.

National Research Project with Western University
